selinux Boot Failure?

Are you experiencing a boot failure with CentOS like this:

```
systemd[1]: Failed to load SELinux policy. Freezing.
—
```

If so, the following instructions **may** fix the problem... or not...

Boot your VM and edit the grub settings

Start your VM.

When you get the boot menu...

```
CentOS Linux (3.10.0-862.11.6.e17.x86_64) 7 (Core)
CentOS Linux (3.10.0-862.e17.x86_64) 7 (Core)
CentOS Linux (0-rescue-875bc69cc9e64acd8c563fb253bc2e29) 7 (Core)

Use the 1 and 4 keys to change the selection.
Press 'e' to edit the selected item, or 'c' for a command prompt.
```

Press 'e' to enter edit mode...

You'll see a display of the grub boot instructions:

Use the arrow keys to move down...

... until you see a line beginning with linux16:

Move the cursor to a good spot in the parameter list for the command ...

... and enter selinux=0:

If you mess this up, hit ESC to abandon your changes, shut your VM down, and go back to the beginning.


Resume booting your VM

Otherwise, press Ctrl-X and let CentOS boot.

If the boot fails again, double-check your work; otherwise, this is probably not going to work out for you.

Reinstall selinux package

Back in CentOS, open a terminal window and reinstall selinux:



Reboot your CentOS VM and see how it goes...

This may take some time due to selinux operations that must be performed.
