Introduction


- Android is an open source mobile operating system

- Its open source nature means that it can be modified by 3rd parties



Manufacturers' Bloatware

pre-installed software made by Manufacturers

- Taking up a lot of space
- Cannot be deleted easily
- Privacy issue



How to Remove the Bloatware

Disadvantages of rooting:

- Risky
- Void warranty
- More Vulnerable to malware and hacking




Privacy Issue

Skins that you can not disable

- Manufacturers often change the theme
- It is unable to change back to the default android interface
 - Manufacturers modify the Android's code





Application Blocked and Features Disabled

- Operators reserve the ability to block certain apps.
- Users are asked for extra money to unblock certain apps.
- Third-party digital wallet systems can also be blocked.
- Operators avoid customers using competing companies' apps and digital wallet.



Data Connection Disabled and How to Solve

it


- Some carriers block the data connection and sharing features.
- Fixes:
 - Third-party tethering app like PdaNet+.
 - Re-enable Android's built-in hotspot features.
 - Phone must be rooted.
 - Xposed framework.
 - Magisk.


Updates Not Released and Delayed

- Manufacturers need approval from carriers before releasing updates
- Older phones often don't receive updates at all
- Manufacturers have to build custom versions of Android for each model



Locked Bootloaders

- Bootloader only approves certain ROMs.
- Unlocking the Bootloader requires extra efforts.
 - Exploit the vulnerability of the system
 - Might brick the phone
- Why unlocking it?
 - A pure Android OS
 - Continue updating old devices
 - 0 ..
